

We invite you to discover Mahe, the main Island of the archipelago in a day! Our knowledgeable team are sure to showcase the highlights of the South part of the island.

The outing will take you to La Plaine St. Andre, home of Trois Frères Distillery, the producers of the local rum brand Takamaka Bay to try out the real taste of the island! Another interesting structure situated on the property is a 200-year-old French colonial planter's house, one of the last remaining traditional houses in Seychelles listed a National Monument in 1982.

The visit then carries on to Jardin du Roi Spice Garden where the first proper spice cultivation was done by the first French colonizers. A typical creole house dating back to 1855 has been converted into a small museum on the grounds. The aromas of vanilla and cinnamon will lure you to the restaurant serving authentic creole delicacies complimented by various homemade juices.

After lunch you will be transferred for a kayaking tour in complete wilderness, you are sure to have an unforgettable adventure filled experience. Exploring the rich biodiversity of wetlands on Mahe in a tropical backdrop of lush greenery with minimal impact to the environment. (Depending on the tide point, the adventure may begin with Kayaking followed by the tour.

Unique design of Roots Seychelles - Prime

Wondering what memorabilia to take back home after an amazing stay on the islands? Well, we have the perfect choice for you. Our back-to-basics creole art experience is done high up on a hill at Roots Seychelles located at Beau vallon with a beautiful view of Silhouette island in the distance. There's a typical creole style shack on the property where their beautiful artworks are already displayed. The atmosphere possesses the primal essence of the island. Nothing fancy just pure authenticity.

After a short welcome and introduction, guests will be guided into the owner's garden to collect their flowers, leaves or stick etc. which can be found on the grounds to be included in the art project. They will then be led to the worktables where the creative process begins. The materials collected can now be arranged to their own preference and pinned onto the fabric laid out. There's a few options of colours to choose from or mix onto the fabric, bringing the whole artwork together.

Once completed, the art will be left to dry out in the sun. Meanwhile, guests will have the chance to try out creole snacks and fresh tropical fruit juice of the day or coconut water at the table. A sumptuous authentic Seychellois meal is prepared on site to offer them a taste of our ancestor's cooking.

Do it yourself with Seyramics! - Prime

The viewpoints may change based on weather conditions; Dans Galla, Ros Gorilla, Mont Signal, Salazie La Solitude, Dame Le Roi, Grand Anse Waterfall, Dan Penpen etc. A quick stop at a local food outlet to purchase lunch and settle at the beach to savor the creole spices barefoot style, just like the locals.

Exploring Praslin in one day from Mahe - Elemental

This special trip takes you to the mystical home of our Coco de Mer nut. 'The Vallée de Mai', a UNESCO World Heritage site on Praslin Island. A walk through this mysterious palm forest, inhaling its unique essence is unlike any other. One could be easily forgiven for assuming that it could have been the legendary Garden of Eden.

Another interesting place of interest is Praslin Museum, a privately owned property on the island showcasing the traditional way of living in the Seychelles. Join the owner of the property for an educational tour of the different medicinal plants on ground and their benefits and uses. What's most interesting about this place are the animals, namely the fruit bats, bunnies, blue doves and various endemic birds. There is a fully functional old-fashioned kitchen which compliments the history surrounding this place. You can try out local delicacies on offer and barbecue with the locals. There are different cultural relics displayed, including local traditional musical instruments.

Moving on to Anse Lazio beach, reputed for its stunning landscape. A perfect mixture of powdery sands blended with crystal clear waters against a lush backdrop of endemic vegetation of different shades of green. This makes for a definite #insta snap!

La Digue Island Boat & Bike Tour from Mahe - Elemental

La Digue Island is the focus of traditional slow-paced creole-living way of life, first inhabited in 1798. With a map in hand, start your cycling adventure by rummaging through the narrow roads that wind their way around the island. The plateau area has a combination of residential dwellings and guest houses with few hotels. The 'Veuve Reserve' is a sanctuary named after the endemic birds which inhabit the area.

A visit to the timeless L'Union Estate is an absolute must, where the old agricultural processing method is preserved, such as the traditional copra mill, built to extract virgin coconut oil following the laborious de-husking of the coconut and extraction of the flesh from the shell. 

The Enchanting Secluded Cove of Anse Major - Elemental

It takes about an hour and half to walk along the northwest coast of Mahé, enjoying the beautiful scenery of green cloaked mountains with spectacular view of the Indian Ocean. Climbing gigantic boulders overlooking Beau Vallon bay and Silhouette Island on the horizon.

Trailing through the cave of Roche l'Eglise, emerging through a mix of endemic plants to taste the purest of fresh water from a mountain stream running down the huge granite to one of the best beaches of the island.

The gigantic boulders mixed with vibrant vegetation make up the hills, boasting one of the most spectacular panoramic view of the Indian Ocean. Once at Anse Major, snorkeling the pristine corals, brimming with diverse marine life is an absolute must!

Mare Aux Cochons – The Wet Land Adventure - Elemental

Once an agricultural area, Mare aux Cochons is now an incredible morass borne from the vestiges of past cultivation. This protected wetland is the intersection through which several trails cross paths. It is the very heart of Morne Seychellois National Park. The hike begins at Le Niol. After several hundred yards of uphill climbing, alternating between dense vegetation and forest glades, the first vista of the west coast and neighbouring islands appear.

Follow the rugged pathway through vast expanse of trees, initially imported for agricultural purposes, namely nutmeg, cloves and cinnamon. The trail continues to a cross section which leads to different routes, our destination takes us to the left where lies the ruins of an abandoned distillery dating back to the 1960s - 1970s. Moving upwards to the Belize plateau, a short-sheltered break is recommended before taking on the next part of the journey.

An unexpected surprise is the fascinating Old Bridge built by Capuchin monks, which appears after another few meters of walking. The different endemic species of trees comes into view as we move closer to the valley with the likes of Bois Rouge (*Dillenia ferruginea*). You might even chance a fortuitous encounter with one of our incredible venom less grass snakes, a popular resident predator, crucial to the balance of this fragile ecosystem unique to the peak of Morne Seychellois.

Morne Blanc - Elemental

With a height of 630m, the Morne Blanc peak starting point is situated in the Morne Seychellois National Park, it passes through an old tea plantation filled with Lemon Grass (Citronelle). A continuous climb to the top of Morne Blanc, a prominent mountain in the west of Mahe. The likes of Capucin (*Northea hornei*), are scattered densely over a wild patch of the climb cloaking thick understorey.

As you keep moving higher up the hill, a cinnamon forest overlaid in luxuriant epiphytes will surround you, looming above an endless array of tea plants, native palms and rare Bird-nest fern (*Asplenium nidus*). As you make the final scramble through foggy woods to the peak, cautiously use the walkway and hand grip support without straying from the path as it takes a treacherous turn with steep drops and hidden holes on both sides. The terrain becomes rugged and the forest floor more stunted with cascading greenery draping the floor. Seedlings of naturalized fruit trees of various species compete with native plants for light beams permeating the dense foliage. Smooth rust-coloured rocks make up the path to a higher elevation where numerous native animals thrive. A notable critter found in this habitat is the world's tiniest frog (*Sooglossus gardineri*), contrary to its miniscule size which grows up to 1cm, its croak is fascinatingly much louder and easier to distinguish.

You will notice that the mosses and ferns coating thick trunks and granite rocks become progressively more dominant at an altitude of approximately 620m as the cloud encompassing the undergrowth becomes thicker. Once you reach the height of 667m demarcated by a small metal disc, dense slopes set above the deep valleys in-between Morne Seychellois (905 m) peak can be seen to your right and on the other overlooking the islands which make up the Baie Ternay Marine National Park. A magnificent view of the north and west coast of Mahe with Port Glaud at the foot of the mountain, a worthy climb!

Copolia Trail - Elemental

Join us on a guided walk within 'Morne Seychellois National Park'. The trail begins next to Sans-Soucis road with a descent into the tropical forest, shaded by a large white trumpet tree (*Tabebuia pallida*), known for its white and pale pink flowers.

The security shack with officers who keeps the trail secured is located directly after on the left. The path climbs up the side of a ravine after a short while, alternating between ascents and descents. After several hundred meters, large blocks of granite begin to loom on either side of the trail. The slope becomes quite steep. A quick stop for a closer look, could lead to spotting the endemic dragonfly hiding underneath the ferns on either side of the narrowed path. crossing a few wooden planks along the way, after about 1.3 km (0.8 mi.) you will come upon a narrow metal ladder which leads to the glaciais plateau with one of the most spectacular view of the west coast of Mahe. Cairns built by hikers are scattered here and there.

You can also see the surrounding peaks. Trois Frères (towering over Victoria), Morne Seychellois, Morne Blanc and Congo Rouge. The view from the edge of the cliff is sure to take your breath away. The Ste. Anne Marine National Park comprising of six islands namely, Ste Anne, Ile aux Cerfs, Ile Moyenne, Ile Longue, Ile Ronde and Ile Cachee. Extra precaution is required when exploring the granite blocks to find the famous pitcher plant (*Nepenthes pervillei*) which only lives at sites higher than 350 m (1,200 ft.) and a permanent resident of these glaciais' formations.

Dans Gallas Trail - Elemental

Let us guide you up the path behind the Seychelles National Park which carries on with continuous climbs supported by a wooden retaining fence. There are several reservoirs above the trail which distributes water throughout the northern part of Mahé. The first scenic overlook will soon appear on the left near the telephone antennas; you will be treated to a magnificent view of Beau Vallon and all the coves to the northwest with Mount Le Niol in the backdrop.

Turning right toward 'Dans Gallas' sign, the vehicle track continues to the left, upwards. An interesting tree to note in this area is the 'Bois Jolie coeur', scrunching one of the leaves brings out the most enchanting fragrance. The views of the west coast becomes more captivating as the altitude increases. After another few minutes of continuous climbing, a shelter comes into view for a much-needed break. Moving to the next leg of the journey, keep an eye out for some old stone walls built in the 19th century. A bit of interesting history here; It is where a group of Ethiopians known as the Gallas, settled in the area after having escaped Arab vessels with help from the British during that period. From there, the trail winds between enormous moss-covered granite blocks surrounded by cinnamon trees (*Cinnamomum zeylanicum*) and jackfruit trees (*Artocarpus heterophyllus*).

The path becomes a bit tricky here, climbing the metal ladders leads to a large vertical rock and splits in two. Take the left-hand path. Extra precaution is required during the steep and slippery climb to reach the top of a large plateau topped with a ridge. The path continues upwards through dense vegetation then turns left to the peak. And behold an astounding view of Victoria, the Capital of Seychelles along with few other inner islands. A perfect memory for a bucket list trip ticked off, with beautiful pictures to take back home.



Fond Ferdinand Nature Reserve Walk Around – from Praslin - Elemental

Opened in 2013, Fond Ferdinand a captivating Nature Reserve is not yet very widely- known which is a great plus for this forest, it is not often frequented. The starting point of this moderate uphill climb is right across the road by Anse Marie Louise beach.

Your personal guided tour begins once you reach the reserve's information center. It is highly recommendable to start in the morning as their last tour is around 1300hrs given that the reserve covers a massive area of about 122 hectares filled with an array of endemic plants and with the spotting of the Seychelles chameleon and of course chirpy birds to compliment the whole scenery. The unique the Coco de Mer palm grows naturally here, scattered over the land.

The continuous climb and winding trail through the valley carries for about 2 – 3 hours of fun exploration(depending on your ability). The height of the journey is the magnificent view overlooking in one direction Curieuse Island, Sister Island, Coco Island and La Digue, while in the other direction an equally- breathtaking panoramic view from Zimbabwe point. Sunsets are especially stunning from this point, centering one's thought to the elements combined to create such a soul pleasing grounded state.



Zip lining- Elemental

In need of a bit of excitement to add to a splendid holiday spent under the sun?

How about a morning tour of the west coast of Mahe, with just a short climb up a hill overlooking the stunning bay of Port Launay. The trail leads to the beginning of eight zips which will take you down a tropical valley with an astounding backdrop.

After such a thrill and maybe a little bit of sweat, there's no better way to cool off than a quick dip in 'Sauzier Falls' found at the lower part of the hills. Pure drinkable water run down from the top of the timeless Morne Seychellois, the highest mountain of the Seychelles and a National Park peaking at 905 meters. The perfect recipe for a good energy boost.

Venn's Town- Elemental

The Mission Ruins of Venn's Town is situated on Mahe, in the South-West of the Morne Seychellois National Park, at an altitude of 450 m. The ruins consist mainly of traces of foundations of 5 buildings built in limestone. It is one of the most meaningful site in Seychelles from the slavery period and its abolition. A new era when an oppressed people was finally granted their freedom. Freed men were given work and the start of their children being educated in the year of 1875, they were taught vocational skills such as carpentry and handicrafts.

This site allows an insight into the past lives of liberated children brought together to learn to be their own masters. A true testimony to the turning point in Seychelles history which subsequently gave birth to this new creole civilization. They set the core foundation to a unique culture, as they began to move to their own tunes. A people with its own dialect of the Creole language which transcended in their music and dances, a figment of the nation's diverse identity. They helped to kick start the economic activities of this new nation through their knowledge of traditional medicines from plants and spices. The site was declared a National Monument in 1984, a place of unique cultural and ecological worth. Nestled in the virgin forests of Morne Seychellois amongst dense vegetations made up of numerous endemic plants and small animals, Venn's Town has a spectacular view of the west coast of the island.

Seyté Tea Factory- Elemental

Founded in 1962, SeyTé tea factory sits amidst the invigorating mountain air of Sans Soucis with a fantastic view of the Western side of Mahe. The cultivation of the best local tea is done across terraces in the Morne Seychellois National Park, supplying the island nation's high consumption. Join the guided tours to learn about the full tea-making process from hand-picking the leaves to drying them out, then packing and on to distribution. Stop by the gift shop to purchase selective tea flavours to share with your loved ones.

Le Jardin du Roi - Spice Garden - Elemental

Situated on a hilly terrain, approximately 2km from Anse Royale beach, the iconic Jardin Du Roi spice garden is a spot not to be missed on the southeastern coast of the main island Mahe. Back in the 18th century, the islands were popular for spice trade. The garden was created by Pierre Poivre a famous horticulturist and botanist in 1770's, soon after, the threat of British invasion forced the governor to burn the plantation and relocate to its current location. Today, it is privately owned and managed by Mrs. Micheline Georges who frequently greets her visitors. She takes care of the entire 100-hectare estate on her own. Have a look at the old planter's house at the Domaine's entrance, converted into a private museum filled with old personal photos, household utensils and equipment used in the past.

Stroll through the garden inhaling nature's fragrant scenery as you wander past the different plants; vines of vanilla stretched across the granite rocks, nutmeg fruits hanging from the trees; there are various other fruits and spices cultivated in her garden, including Cytherea fruit, breadfruit, vanilla, lemongrass, mango, guava, coffee and coconut. Carry on to the aviaries section which houses many birds as well as bunnies, say hello to the ageless giant tortoises in the park as you trail back to the restaurant. The aromas of vanilla and cinnamon will lure you to the restaurant serving authentic creole delicacies complimented by various homemade juices of lime, papaya, passion fruit or mango depending on the season. Be sure to try the fish served in banana leaf! You can purchase spice samples and other island mementos at the souvenir shop on your way out.

La Plaine St Andre - Takamaka Rum Distillery - Elemental

La Plaine St Andre is a 200-year-old French colonial planter's house, one of the last remaining traditional houses in Seychelles listed a National Monument in 1982. The property once covered over 60 acres of land at its peak and played a big role in the agricultural economy of the Seychelles in the 1900s, growing cinnamon, vanilla, coconut and patchouli for export to Europe. With a rich history dating back to the time of the first settlers in Seychelles the structure was built by the Jorre de St. Jorre family in 1792, it was a plantation estate set amongst exotic gardens. Throughout the years, it has filled many functions as a coconut mill, a boat repair yard and a regal car garage. Once destroyed in fire, it was rebuilt to its original splendour. At some point in time, the property was left abandoned through lack of funding. Since then, it has gone through a few transitions with the most recent being an Eco Museum, restaurant, an art gallery and distillery.

Presently, it is home to Trois Frères Distillery, the producers of local rum brand Takamaka. La Plaine St André has been a part of the Takamaka story for over a decade. This iconic heritage site encompasses a small museum, a medicinal garden, historical ruins of a past epoch and of course the two stars of the property, Giant Aldabra tortoises Taka and Maka. Join the guided tour to learn more about the history of the Takamaka and the processes which gives this rum its very distinctive flavours. Stay for the rum tasting session which follows right after the tour or check out the many delicious cocktails and snacks from the Rum Shack and food truck on the property.

Time to try out the real taste of the island!

National Historical Museum - Elemental

Once a Supreme Court during the colonial-era, this historical landmark has been restored and converted into The National Museum of History. Situated in the centre of Victoria, across Liberty House also known as Queen's Building in the 1940s which now houses the post office. The museum is commissioned to acquire and safeguard historical artifacts for the people of Seychelles and their future generations, to keep stock of past events that have brought the nation to its current state and trajectory.

Charged with providing awareness of the island nation's cultural heritage, the 300-year-old journey starts on the ground floor. Exhibits of relics such as the oldest map drawn in 1517, the Stone of Possession, model ships, old cannons, remains of treasures found, the list of slaves numbered on record and the capitulation of the French colony to the British then on to the democratic state that is now 'The Republic of Seychelles'. The top floor displays gifts of state in one room and in the other, remnants of the old way of life with its traditions and folklores are illustrated. It takes about an hour to complete the guided tour or visitors can wander on their own at their own pace.

The museum is divided into different galleries and exhibition areas:

- Early discovery to Crown colony
- Crown colony to Independence (1903-1976)
- Nationhood (1976-2018)
- Gift of State (Presidential gifts of state)
- Creole Culture (Traditional Life)

Biodiversity - Elemental

The National Biodiversity Centre is located at Barbarons, in the western part of Mahe, just 30 minutes' drive from Victoria via La Misère. The concept of this centre was first introduced in 1998, when 17 hectares of land were turned into a conserved area for diverse rare species. A sanctuary for at least 115 different plants of which 29 are indigenous to the island.

A walk through the Garden will allow you to appreciate the unique plants of Seychelles including six endemic Palms of the country. There is a nursery where seeds and seedlings are preserved to ensure the continuity of the species.

SemiSub Adventure Seychelles - Elemental

The Semi-Submarine is a marine vessels that always stay above sea level, while its hull remain below water providing spectacular views of the reef and sea life. Here's your chance to see the stunning reefs of Seychelles in comfort without getting wet in this hour-long trip. The vessel is up to marine safety standards with the highest quality build.

Hop onboard the Semi-Submarine with your family and friends for a unique cruising experience, soaking in the sunshine and salty breeze on the deck. The excitement starts downstairs in the air-conditioned underwater observatory exploring the rich scenery beneath the sea, live corals, colourful marine life and seaweed, granite rocks, sandy plains with sea grass meadows in between. You may even spot a green turtle or two!

Vallee de Mai - Elemental

Declared a World Heritage Site by UNESCO in 1983, Vallee de Mai is home to the Coco de Mer, the world's largest existing nut!

This mysterious forest which General Gordon of Khartoum believed to be the original site of the Garden of Eden with the Coco de Mer as its forbidden fruit, is the haven to one of the world's rarest birds, the Seychelles Black Parrot found nowhere else on earth.

Even to this day, as you stroll through the Vallee's well-marked paths studying the bewitching patterns of light and shades through droplets glistening on the leaves, listening to the fantastical calls of remarkable birds dwelling in these woods, one would be forgiven for believing that they have stumbled upon Nature's most secret realm.

Our guided tour of the Vallée will reveal the mysteries of a sparsely lit world bustling with life in silent symphony, from the carpeted leaves on the forest floor to the canopy made from the 6 palms unique to Seychelles, inhabited by miniscule frogs, lizards and some praying mantis & chameleons camouflaged in nature, disguised as a random piece of wood or leaves and sometimes even rocks.
